Aboriginal Elders and youths capture history with Lotterywest grant

- WADJAK Northside Aboriginal Community Group receives \$123,376 Lotterywest grant
- Twelve-month program will facilitate elders to engage with young people to build knowledge in culture, language and history
- The project will train participants in recording their history and stories

Premier Mark McGowan and Mirrabooka MLA Janine Freeman today presented a Lotterywest grant of \$123,376 to the WADJAK Northside Aboriginal Community Group in Balga.

The funding will go towards a 12-month project to facilitate elders to engage with young people in the northern suburbs to build knowledge in their culture, language and history.

The project will train participants in how to record their history and stories through documenting, conserving and presentation skills, creating the opportunity to learn valuable skills.

Participants in the program will learn computer skills, gain experience in photography, videography and data storage and be trained in how to deliver a presentation.

The grant will assist with the costs of running the program and purchasing equipment.

This project will add value to WADJAK's existing mentoring program and other services, including managing an Aboriginal Community Resource Centre in Balga, which hosts programs such as elders and women's groups, Back to Country camps and mobile clinics.
